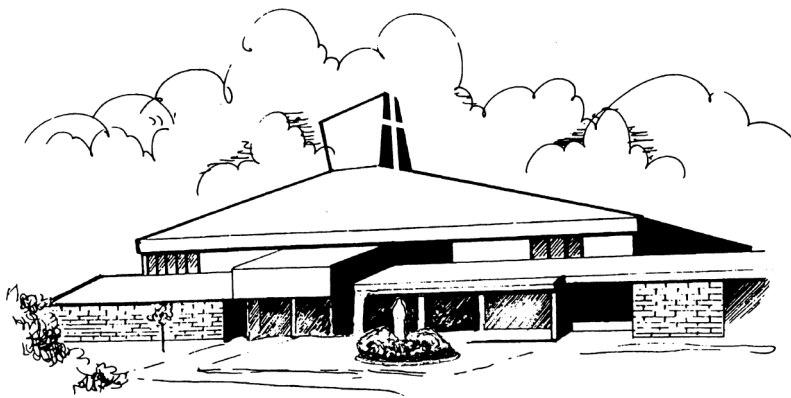

PARENTAL PARTICIPATION

“Perhaps the most fundamental contribution you can make to the faith formation of your child - is to mature in the faith yourself.”

Joseph Cardinal Bernadin

The family is the ideal and most fruitful environment for religious education. Our Parish Religious Education programs are therefore rooted in and related to the faith life of the family. Our programs only take root and grow when they are reinforced and supported at home.

Sharing in your child's religious education will help you grow in your faith. We encourage parents to take an active role in their child's religious growth. The gift of faith to your child is God's gift to give, but the nurturing of that gift goes on mainly in the day-to-day living of family life.

Your active participation in your faith (weekly attendance at Mass and frequent reception of the Sacraments of The Eucharist and Reconciliation), as well as participating in your child's religious education program, attending parental education presentations, adult education courses, the preparation and follow up to your child's classes or volunteering to teach or assist in our program are all ways to nurture your child's faith and grow in your own.

Please call the Religious Education Office if you have any questions, comments or concerns. We encourage communication between the home and the parish.

RULES OF CONDUCT

Pope John XXIII uses the school rules of conduct. These are based on respect for ourselves and for each other.

- 1. No hats are to be worn in the classrooms, parish center or church.*
- 2. The use of cell phones during class is prohibited.*
- 3. No chewing gum or candy in the building.*
- 4. Classes begin and end on time.*
- 5. Everyone is expected to follow the guidelines of individual classrooms.*
- 6. Violence of any kind; verbal or physical will not be accepted nor tolerated.*
- 7. Everyone will use good manners.*
- 8. All of the Religious Education staff is to be treated with respect.*

GENERAL INFORMATION

REGISTERED PARISHIONER: A person or family that has a completed census form on file at the parish office, and is a contributing member of Pope John XXIII parish by using Pope John XXIII envelope system.

***If you have filled out a Religious Education form, this registers your family for Religious Education only and does not register you as a parishioner of Pope John XXIII.**

NON-REGISTERED PARISHIONER: If you have, or plan to have, your children attend Pope John XXIII Religious Education classes and are **not a registered parishioner of Pope John XXIII** you must have written permission from your Pastor of the parish you are registered with stating the reason for attending Pope John XXIII Religious Education Program.

BAPTISMAL CERTIFICATES: A copy of your child's baptismal certificate is **required** for Grades 2 and 9. If your child has been baptized here at Pope John XXIII you do not have to furnish a copy. You must, however, submit a form that states the child has been baptized here with **child's name, date of birth, and baptismal date**. If your child has had a name change we need to see the document from the court with the old and new names. The Church where the Baptism occurred must also be notified of a legal name change.

ABSENCES: Absences disrupt the religious education process. If a child is to miss class for any reason, it is requested that you please call the Religious Education Office, coordinator or teacher so that this will be listed as an excused absence. When a student is absent, he/she is responsible for the work that has been missed. It is the parents' responsibility to make sure that the child makes up the missed assignment so that their child is prepared for the next weeks class. Excessive absences will be reviewed by the coordinator with the parent.

*** Absences on the Sacramental Levels are as follows:

GRADE TWO: **NO UNEXCUSED ABSENCES ARE ALLOWED.**

CONFIRMATION: **NO UNEXCUSED ABSENCES ARE ALLOWED DURING THIS PROGRAM.**

Three excused absences on these levels may necessitate postponing reception of the sacrament or having make up sessions.

DISCIPLINE POLICY: If a child is disruptive, rude to the teacher or students in class, the following action will be taken:

First Offense: Child will meet with Grade Level Coordinator

Second Offense: Child, parent and Grade Level Coordinator will meet with Director

Third Offense: Parents will be called immediately to come and get student. Parents will then be requested to attend class with their child for the remainder of the year.

FEES: There is no fee for the 2018 - 2019 year.

TRAFFIC: When transporting students to and from classes, please use the main parking lot and Parish Center entrance for all drop offs. This ensures a safer, more expedient flow of traffic. Parents are asked to park their cars and walk into the parish center to wait for their students to be dismissed on Wednesday night. On Thursday evenings, parents are asked to enter through the side door next to the main entrance when picking up their children. When classes have been dismissed parents will then be allowed to pick up their child at his/ her classroom. This will prevent accidents on the grounds or in the parking lot.

SPECIAL NEEDS: If your child has a special need e.g., learning disability, allergy, etc., make this known to the coordinator and indicate it on the registration form so we might serve your child better. All information is treated with confidentiality. Should something occur at school or at home which might affect your child's experience at class or with others it would be responsible to let us know so that we may be able to better assist your child in need.

CANCELLATION OF CLASS: No School. No Class. If classes need to be canceled due to bad weather you may call the Faith Formation Office (315-652-1094). Weather announcements are on the answering machine. Please use your own good judgment where the weather is concerned. We will also notify the television stations 3, 5, 9, 10 to post on the scroll.

Pope John XXIII Faith Formation A CURRICULUM OVERVIEW

PRE-SCHOOL (3&4 year olds) - I Am Special Series, Published by Our Sunday Visitor

This program is designed and geared to the comprehension and the ability level of this age group. Each volume helps the child learn how unique and different they are, and how special they are to God. Stories, questions, shared experiences and numerous activities allow the children to discover the wonders of the earth, creation, their five senses, the people, places and events in their lives. This three stage program provides opportunities for song and prayer as the children learn to give thanks and praise to God for their uniqueness and the special world in which they live.

KINDERGARTEN - Faith First, Published by RCL

Focus: CREATION

To develop an awareness of God's goodness in giving life as seen in God's visible creation.

Beginning Prayers:

The Sign of the Cross, The Hail Mary, The Lord's Prayer, The Glory Be to the Father

Parents:

Each day point out the beauty of God's creation and say one prayer with your child.

GRADE 1 - Faith First, Published by RCL

Focus: TRINITY

This is a year of introductions in your child's specialness to God through Baptism. Discussion on your child's part in his human family and how special he/she is in God's Family.

Introduction to the parts of the Mass and Liturgical seasons and events of the year. Advent, Christmas, Lent, Easter and Pentecost.

Beginning Prayers:

The Sign of the Cross, The Hail Mary, The Lord's Prayer, The Glory Be to the Father

Parents:

Encourage your child to share with you about Jesus. Listen! Review with your child what he/she is learning in class.

GRADE 2 - Celebrating Reconciliation and Eucharist, Published by Harcourt

Beginning Prayers:

The Sign of the Cross, The Hail Mary, The Lord's Prayer, The Glory Be To the Father, Act of Contrition

Parents:

Say the prayers with your child and be sure to TAKE YOUR CHILD TO CHURCH EVERY WEEK. Encourage your child to participate in mass by saying the mass responses. Be sure to attend Parent Sessions and Family Liturgies. The Sacrament of Reconciliation is celebrated in January of the second grade year.

GRADE 3 - A Catholic Child's First Bible***Focus: CHURCH***

Knowledge of the chief truths of the Catholic Faith as expressed in "The Apostles Creed", a review of the Sacraments of Eucharist and Reconciliation. In addition to learning how to say the Rosary.

Prayers to Know:

Act of Contrition, Apostles Creed, Rosary

Parents:

When attending church encourage your child to participate in reciting the Nicene Creed and the Lord's Prayer at mass. Students will be receiving Rosaries. Please say the Rosary as a family. Review the Apostles Creed and its' meaning with your child.

GRADE 4 – A Catholic Child's First Bible***Focus: CHRISTIAN MORALITY***

In depth study of the Ten Commandments and the Beatitudes stress the Law of Love, the heart of the Gospel, this will lead, help them explore and respond positively to God's guidance in their lives.

Material to Know:

The Ten Commandments and the Beatitudes, Rite of Reconciliation, Act of Contrition

Parents:

Review the Apostles' Creed and its' meaning with your child. Help your child to develop a Catholic Christian conscience through a positive interpretation of the Ten Commandments.

GRADE 5 - International Student Bible for Catholics (Students will use for 6 years)***Focus: SACRAMENTS Catechetical year 2017-2018***

The students become aware of the presence of Christ acting within him/her through an in-depth study of the Sacraments, the Mass, and the Liturgical year.

Material: This course is offered every other year. The fifth and sixth grade curriculum is combined in an interactive format.

Parents:

TAKE YOUR CHILD TO CHURCH. Encourage your children to share and discuss their feelings regarding the Mass and the homily with you.

GRADE 6 - International Student Bible for Catholics***Focus: SALVATION HISTORY Catechetical year 2018-2019***

The students become aware of how God revealed Himself to us through the inspired word of Sacred Scripture. The Old Testament ~ Hebrew Scriptures, through saving events, people and messages. The Gospels are then explored in fulfilment of the Old Testament.

Material: This course is offered every other year. The fifth and sixth grade curriculum is combined in an interactive format.

GRADE 7 - International Student Bible for Catholics***Focus: CHRIST IN THE NEW TESTAMENT (RCL Benzinger) AND THE BIBLE (2017-2018)***

This year a thorough study of the New Testament presents a balanced profile of Jesus in his person, his ministry, and the mystery of his identity. While engaging in this study of Jesus' life and the changing needs and challenges of adolescents discipleship will focus on how being a disciple of Jesus can help young people respond to the needs and challenges they face.

Parents:

Set aside a half hour each week to read the New Testament. Stress spontaneous prayer in your child's life especially to appreciate the silence that is sometimes experienced in prayer.

GRADE 8 - Student Bible for Catholics, Published by New American Bible***Focus: LIFE IN CHRIST JESUS (RCL Benzinger) and THE BIBLE(2018-2019)***

Authentic Christian morality is rooted in our ability to see and love ourselves the way Jesus sees and loves us.

Parents:

Encourage your son or daughter to participate in spiritual activities and projects. Your support is the positive influence they need in their life to make their faith a *top* priority. Please be sure your child attends weekly Mass.

Grades 9 & 10 - Student Bible for Catholics, Published by New American Bible

This is an intensive two-year study in preparation for the Sacrament of Confirmation for students in highschool beginning in ninth grade. Our program requires 40 hours of classroom participation, minimum of 30 hours of service, retreats and participation in the Holy Week Services. This program is designed to help the candidates understand the commitment that is involved in their next step to full maturity within the Catholic Church, and our Catholic Faith. The candidates will look at the meaning and history of the Pentecost experience and how that personally effects them in their commitment to the church. Confirmation candidates will also use their talents to help others at home, here at our parish, and out in the community at large. We will be very involved in service, social functions and retreat experiences.

Parents:

Give the confirmation candidate serious positive support for regular class attendance, spiritual activities and projects, reading scripture. Please continue weekly Mass attendance as a family. This support will lead to a richer and more meaningful experience. Let them see you as a role model for their faith.

OTHER PROGRAMS**FAMILY CATECHESIS**

An opportunity for families to have children never Baptized, or those who have not attended religious education to prepare for the Sacraments of Initiation. These sessions meet on Sunday mornings at 9:15 am. Please call the religious education office for more details. We have sessions for elementary, middle or High School aged children.

LITURGY OF THE WORD: Weekly at the 5:00pm and 10:30am Mass

A dismissal of the children in Pre-k, kindergarten to Grade 5 to hear and learn about the Sunday Readings. They return to the Mass during the Offertory Procession to celebrate the Liturgy of the Eucharist with the assembly.

2018 - 2019 Dates: Sept. – June.

SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION PROGRAMS

EUCCHARIST

Children need to attend Grade 1 before enrolling in the First Communion Process.

This Sacrament is celebrated in the second semester of the second grade year. This intensive preparation period seeks to establish the concepts of Eucharist within the context of Church as a loving community. One way a community celebrates this love is through breaking bread and sharing the cup. Weekly mass attendance is important for your child to understand the very basics of their preparation for Eucharist.

Parents are invited to participate fully in this program by attending parent sessions that gives parents the outline of the Eucharist program. This enables parents to teach their child at home as a follow-up to class instruction.

The texts "Called to Celebrate the Eucharist" by Our Sunday Visitor involves both parents and teachers in the preparation and centers on the liturgy and its' meaning in our lives. Specific dates for classes and Parent Meetings are listed on the next page of this booklet.

RECONCILIATION

The Sacrament is celebrated on a Wednesday Evening in December.

This preparation requires the help of parents by attending parent sessions and mirroring God's forgiveness in your own lives.

We ask that you review the following points with your child:

1. Help your child clarify the difference between making a mistake and committing a sin
2. The Act of Contrition and its meaning
3. Scripture stories of forgiveness:
 - a. The Forgiving Father Luke 15:14-24;
 - b. The Lost Sheep Luke 15:4-7;
 - c. Zacchaeus Luke 19:1-10
4. Examination of Conscience
5. The Rite of Reconciliation

CONFIRMATION

Pre-requisites for admission into the confirmation program include completion of grades 6, 7, and 8. Grade 9 and 10: This program is for candidates, parents and sponsors using special liturgies, journal recording, retreat experience and service projects. This program culminates in their free choice to be "sealed with the Spirit", the gift of the Father. As members of the Catholic Church strengthened by the Spirit, they will be called to discipleship and witness of Christ. In Confirmation Preparation the emphasis will be on faith development, self awareness and witnessing our faith in action.

Please use the **Parish Center Entrance** for Religious Education. This will be the only entrance used for the nights of Religious Education. On Thursday evening please come through the door next to the main entrance to pick up your children. Thank you.
